

Lynnville City Council Meeting Minutes

March 9, 2015

The City Council of the City of Lynnville met in regular session on March 9, 2015, at 5:30 p.m. at the City Hall in Lynnville, Iowa. Mayor Kelly Bryan welcomed those present to the meeting, called the meeting to order; and asked those present to stand, face the flag, and repeat the Pledge of Allegiance. Council members present were: Bev Van Maanen, Rahn Savage, Roger Beason, Terry Fraker, and Roy James. Guests: Linda Russell and Faye Brand.

Approval was made to amend the agenda with two items: Dog Bite Incident and Driver's Ed meeting room request.

MINUTES OF PRIOR MEETING: A motion was made by Beason, and seconded by James, to approve February, 2015, minutes. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

Dead End Sign: DeWitt will submit a request to Jasper County to place a flag on the I-80 sign. Alliant Energy has approved a Dead End sign to be hung on the pole.

NEW BUSINESS

DOG BITE INCIDENT: Linda Russell was present to discuss and review an incident she experienced when she was bitten by a dog owned by the Hill residence. Mayor Bryan will contact the sheriff's office. Ms. Russell will submit medical and clothing receipts to Mayor Bryan.

The issue of how to enforce the ordinance was discussed at length. The Clerk will send a letter to all Lynnville residents stating their dogs must be licensed before April 5, 2015; if not, penalties will be enforced. In addition to regular Clerk Office Hours, the Clerk's office will be open on Saturday, April 4, for dog registrations.

PUBLIC HEARING ON PROPOSED FY2016 BUDGET: A motion was made by James, and seconded by Van Maanen, to approve the FY2016 Budget. Motion carried.

WINDOW TREATMENTS: The Lynnville Woman's Club has offered to pay half of the cost to install window treatments in two of the windows in the Community Center. Van Maanen will obtain bids and work with Woman's Club.

CONSIDER LIQUOR LICENSE RENEWAL FOR LINDEN HOUSE: Due to change in management at Linden House, this item was removed from agenda.

CONSIDER DELINQUENT UTILITIES FOR CUSTOMER: Steve Limbo contacted Clerk to say he has not lived at his Lynnville residence since mid-November and does not feel he is responsible for utility bills from mid-November until now. The Clerk will communicate to Limbo he is responsible for all past due balances to date, mowing, and sidewalk snow removal. In addition, the curb stop at this residence is not functioning properly. The city will provide the curb stop; however, he is responsible for the installation.

DRIVER’S ED MEETING REQUEST: The Clerk received a request to use the City Hall or Fire Station for upcoming Driver’s Ed training. The council approved DeWitt investigating the possibility of using the library.

MAINTENANCE REPORT: De Witt provided the Maintenance Report.
